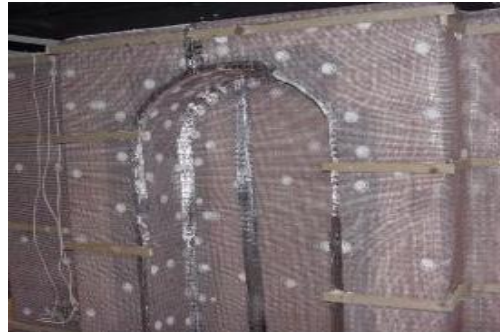




Cellar Conversion, Victorian end terrace south London



This started out as a disused cellar with damp brick walls and floor (top left).

The arched fireplace support was lined with a plastic meshed membrane (top 2nd from left) which was rendered over thus preserving the shape and character of this feature.

Other walls were lined with ourThermaDry insulated membrane and lined with plasterboard and an underfloor drainage system was installed to prevent the future risk of flooding.

A new external stairwell can be seen externally and internally (top right two pics) thus allowing a secondary means of escape as well as introducing natural light.

To preserve headroom, recessed plasterboard panels and lighting were fitted in-between the ceiling joists as can be seen in main picture to the left showing the finished room.

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
